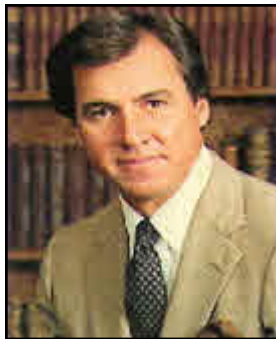

Legislative matters: Colorado representative Marsha Looper has sent a signed copy of Senate Bill 11-031 with a cover letter thanking the CCCC for its leadership in getting this consolidated and passed. Harold Naber is assembling the information but has to sort out all the section number changes in the Colorado Revised Statutes. Harold is scheduling a meeting with Rep. Looper and the Colorado Department of Revenue to discuss bills to (1) change the requirement for bonding under the Rebuilder's Certificate of Title section 42-6-108.5 and (2) allow licensed auto dealers to certify VIN on engine changes for vehicles over 50 years old. Subsequent meetings will explore reestablishing collector series status for collector vehicles at least 25 years of age.

Cruises, Havana and Colfax: Dick Thompson reported on the success of the Havana Cruise and distributed copies of the program, which included feature articles about supporting clubs. T-shirt sales were handled by Looking Glass Corvette Club. Police presence helped minimize disruptive driving. Estimates were that six or seven thousand vehicles took part.
